

WORLD DAY FOR CONSECRATED LIFE



5th - 7th grade - Deesis

This extraordinarily beautiful art piece was created with the talents of the students in 5th, 6th, and 7th grade. Every student wrote (painted) a rectangle piece of the Deesis icon and each class worked on one figure. This piece is particularly special and deserves to be displayed and used for prayer in your home. Deesis (/delˈiːsls/, day-EE-siss) Greek for "prayer" or "supplication." Christ, the Son of God, appears at the center of the composition with IC XC, the Greek abbreviation for "Jesus Christ." The Virgin Mary is a powerful protector. She appears at Christ's right hand with the abbreviation, MP Θ Y, "Mother of God." John was a prophet and cousin of Christ, whose preaching and baptizing prepared the way for Christ's ministry in the Gospels. He appears on Christ's left with the name, "Saint John the Forerunner."

8th grade - St. Joseph Catholic Church screen print
The 8th grade class presents a multilayer, dimensional,
silkscreen print of St. Joseph Catholic Church. This
print is a rendering of the South facing architectural
elevation of the church. Each 8th grade student
contributed a drawing of isolated architectural elements,
which were then collaged together. The students then
screen printed their collaborative image in orange and
gold. This lovely print addition of one, illustrates the
culmination of the 8th grade classes' communal effort
and is a representation of their time together at Saint

Joseph Catholic School.
