

NOTEWORTHY

PLEASE STAY UNTIL THE END OF MASS

The Eucharist is the heart of the Catholic faith—Jesus Christ truly present under the appearance of bread and wine. As the Catechism teaches, Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist begins at consecration and remains as long as the Eucharistic species exist (CCC 1377).

This means that when we receive Communion, Jesus remains truly present within us for several minutes. Many saints have recommended offering at least 15 minutes of prayerful thanksgiving after receiving Him, savoring this sacred time for a heart-to-heart with the Lord.

There's a well-known story of St. Philip Neri, who once sent two altar boys with candles to follow a man who left Mass right after Communion. When the man asked why, St. Philip gently replied, "You are carrying Our Lord. Since you did not stay to adore Him, I sent others to do so."

While we understand life can be busy, staying through the end of Mass—even just a few more minutes—honors Christ's presence and allows us to respond with love and gratitude. Thank you for helping us foster a deeper reverence for the gift of the Eucharist in our parish community.
